A special note:

If you are joining the meeting as a participant using Zoom you will be shown as an 'attendee'. You will be able to see and hear members of the committee in order to follow the business being discussed; your own microphone will be automatically muted. The names of all attendees will be visible to the host of the meeting, who is usually the meeting's Chairman or a Council officer. If you have registered to address the meeting a Council officer will unmute your microphone at the appropriate point and mute it again when you have finished. If you have accessed the meeting using a device with a webcam you may be visible to members of the committee and other attendees whilst you speak.

If there are confidential items being considered in the meeting and the press and public need to be excluded you will be disconnected from the meeting (i.e. your access to the meeting will be turned off) before the committee moves onto these items; the Chairman will make you aware of this before it takes place. The host will disconnect you when appropriate and a notification will appear on your screen notifying you that you have been disconnected from the meeting. If at any point throughout the meeting you wish to leave you can select 'Leave Meeting' and this will exit you from the meeting.

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
