- Local authorities and LPAs must publish a biodiversity report.
- ECC must complete the first consideration of what action to take for biodiversity by 1 January 2024
- Actions that can be taken are split broadly in three areas:
  - Manage land to improve biodiversity
  - Educate, advise and raise awareness
  - Review internal policies and processes
- First half of 2024 produce a Biodiversity Plan to set out actions
- 2024 2026 Delivery of biodiversity actions
- 1st January 2026 Biodiversity Report of delivery

## **Essex Forest Initiative Update**


- Estimates Essex Forest Initiative (EFI) nos 130,000 for this year
- EFI have secured
- Local Authority Treescapes Fund £300,000
   Urban Tree Challenge £2,100,000
- For every ECC £1... EFI have raised £11.17 from external funds
- EFI also actively manage 154 hectares of woodland
- ECC Tree Statements for ECC estate to be approved imminently



## Energy and Waste



- Essex County Council's work on community energy was recognized at the Community Energy England awards where ECC won in the category of "Supportive Local Authority"
- Tollesbury Climate Partnership a group supported by ECC
   were shortlisted for the "Advancing Innovation" award for their project to retrofit the local primary school
- More communities continue to come forward looking to develop local energy projects. We expect new community energy groups to form in Maldon (Heybridge & Maldon + Burnham on Crouch) following recent successful "community hall" meetings



- Positive conversations on-going to set up new groups in Harlow and Basildon including a youth led community energy group
- Positive engagement with Church of England national environment team, upcoming meeting with Chelmsford
   Diocese to discuss opportunities for joint working on community energy



## Renewable energy + Retrofit

- CommuniPower a "whole village" approach to decarbonising heat and power successful kick off in Uttlesford working with Saffron Waldon Community Energy, Uttlesford DC and Community Energy South
- Retrofit: Home Upgrade Grant which runs to March 2025 funding allocation of £18.7m for Essex to deliver retrofit measures in low income households – programme is now live
- Retrofit: ECC working with Districts to agree mechanism for administering OFGEM Energy Company Obligation (ECO) 4 funding to unlock further energy efficiency grants for low income households
- OFGEM Strategic Innovation Fund Project "SHIELD" low cost heat and power for low income households- £0.5m Alpha bid to pilot technology in 2 households with UKPN was successful will now bid for Beta stage of £10m+ to fund scale up

## Renewable Energy + Retrofit

- Scaling up Local energy Innovate UK "Pathfinder Places" fund:
  - EssNet removing multiple "non-technical" barriers to enable local communities to bring forward local renewable energy projects at scale – successful bid to the Pathfinders programme to extend existing work
  - 2. Shift to Net Zero scaling up investment in getting our schools to net zero successful bid to the Pathfinders programme
- Solar Installations
  - Exploring options for roll out of solar across the schools estate in Essex working with community groups
  - Kicked off work with Local Partnerships to look at the viability of solar farm developments on 2 sites owned by ECC with options for private wire connections. Exploring options for those developments to be financed and owned by communities.
  - Secured £50K grant from DESNZ Net Zero Hub to explore feasibility of installing energy centres (Solar canopies and storage) at ECC park and ride sites




## **Waste Strategy for Essex**

- 390,000 households targeted throughout Essex
- Information and support coupled with distribution of liners and containers and containers.

IN THE MATTER OF THE BUILDING REGULATIONS, PART I, 2021 AND THE PLANNING AND ENDROY ACT 2008

Re: Ability of local planning authorities to not local plan policies that require development to achieve energy efficiency standards above studding Regulations

INTRODUCTION AND SUMMART

- I am united to advise fixes County County ("the County") and the fixes Climate Action Commission ("CAR") on the ship of local planning enfortaints ("LPAR") to set local plan policies excellating energy efficiency standards for one buildings which exceed these in the Building Regulations, Next 1, or all segs to beyond the 19% engreement over Building Regulations (Set 1, or all segs to beyond the 19% engreement over Building Regulations (Set 1, or feetered to in 249'238). - 2. For the reasons set out in detail below:
- 2.1 The Planning and Energy Act 2001 ("PEA 2008") empowers LPAs, through their local plus policies, to set higher tegens for energy performance standards for development in their near than the national basedine, provided such standards are "resounded" and comply with the stand plan-making impriments of section 39 of the Planning and Compulsary Purchase Act 2004.
- 2.2 Some confusion over the ability of LPAs to set standards above the national baseline seems to have arisen due to:

- Work beginning on £8M Local EV infrastructure bid.

  - M25 Junction 28 into Brentwood
  - Hatfield Peverel to Boreham.
- Rolling annual Cycling and Walking consultations currently Basildon, Castle Point, Rochford and Witham.

Policy

- Local Transport Plan and Place & Movement (new road hierarchy) endorsed by scrutiny
- Speed Management Strategy under review

#### **Sustainable Transport**

Active Travel

- "All Roads lead from home" journey planning tool won Community Engagement of the Year at Modeshift Sustainable Travel Awards last week.
- Essex Pedal Power was recognised as highly commended at both the Highways Awards and the UK Active Awards.
- Colne Causeway Crossing in Colchester (Active Travel 4) and Station Way, Colchester (Active Travel 2) completed.
- Active Travel 4 grass routes engagement completed new approach, worked well



- Intended to submit ZEBRA 2 bid Basildon.
- ~£500,000 funding from Department for Transport awarded to Essex, Thurrock and Southend to recruit 6 transport officers who will help stamp out nuisance behaviour on public transport.
- Travel Essex Website in testing hoping to go live this week.

Major projects

- · Army and Navy funding has been awarded
- Department for Transport announcement on pothole funding unclear what it means for ECC
- · Winter Service has launched
- · Beaulieu Bridge has opened

#### **Great Start**

- Accreditation scheme Starting with Waste focus.
- Help businesses with managing their waste and on their sustainability journey.
- Content to include webinars, videos, workshops, guides, calculators and downloadable documentation.
- Digital badging to aid accreditation with badges being created for the scheme to be delivered on completion of individual elements of Great Start.
- Working on producing first version of content in a PDF format and deliver in early 2024



#### We Rise

- Youth-led movement that is intended to engage young people from communities not typically engaging in skills / career development and / or with lower aspirations.
- The program is intended to engage young people to identify the skills / training / mentoring / employability support they want to see in their place and then for ECC and partners to facilitate.
- Work initially focused on Canvey Island however we are now pushing the boundaries out to also include Basildon and communities in between.
- Arranging mentoring to the young people with Ford, Microsoft and Police
- We are working on rolling out free introduction to coding for these young people as a green skill
