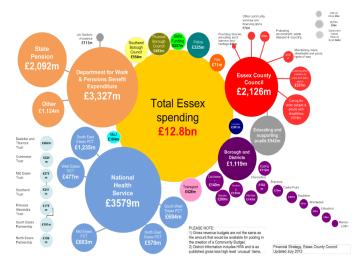

What are Community Budgets?

Organising public spending by place, not organisation or services; redesign services around communities' and residents' needs; and ensure service users/citizens/customers are at the heart of this redesign

It is system reform, rather than structural reform

Key Drivers: Financial and demand pressure, smarter public services, reduced dependency on the state, reduced bureaucracy and localism.

What has happened since 22nd Nov 2012?

Date	Description
Nov 12	 Resolved funding and resourcing issues to continue WECB projects until end of March 2013 Various meetings and workshops held with partners to review costs/benefits model and to develop further the proposed models within the existing business cases. Feedback and outcomes of these meetings will be incorporated in the revised business cases.
Nov – Dec 12	 Various workshops with CCG's took place to develop their Integrated Commissioning Plans – detailed update will be provided as part of a separate agenda item. Commissioning priorities workshop(s) took place to ensure WECB business case recommendations will be considered within these plans.
14 th Dec 12	 WECB Executive Board – review of first DRAFT ToR for Essex Integrated Board (EIB)

Domestic Abuse

- Researching good practice in multi agency working from other areas, including
 Strathclyde Police (Perpetrators) and Hertfordshire (support for victims) and looking at
 new academic research to prove what is effective
- In the process of developing Pilots in specific localities where there is a high incidence of DA
- Continue high level strategic work with Police, Health, Education on activities and commissioning,
- Specific work with Mike Gogarty planned to look at activities and the funding/ commissioning model across CCGs, scooping out how DA multi agency can work with mental health / drugs and alcohol
- Develop appropriate screening programmes
- Working with the Police and Crime Commissioner to bring him up to speed on Community Safety and investment

Business Case Update - Family Solutions

(formerly Families with Complex Needs)

Key Deliverables to Jan 2013

- Programme now merged with Family Solutions ('Troubled Families') and will adopt that title henceforth
- 4 Family Solutions teams now up and running (Clacton, Harlow, Braintree and Basildon)
- Establishment of a detailed Family Solution Project Plan
- Effective Support consultation events and online questionnaire completed
- Shared Family Assessment and Essex Family Referral Form developed and currently being piloted.
- Volunteering Workshop held to support the design of service specification, initial draft complete

Progress January 2013

- Site visit to Hertfordshire's Targeted Advice Team, informing the development of Early Help Advice and Information Hub.
- Initial IT and data specification requirements for teams identified
- Theory of Change workshop delivered exploring working methodology models
- Engagement of Borough, City and District Councils with finance and resource 'asks'
- Workforce training piloted in first four Family Solutions teams

Business Case Update

Strengthening Communities

- A series of engagement workshops and individual meetings have been held with stakeholders and key partners to further define and appraise options
- Approaches are also being developed to strengthen community-based commissioning and grant-funding
- Further workshops and engagement meetings are being scheduled throughout January and February
- Parallel activity to complete the first DRAFT of the business case by start of Feb 13
