## The bigger picture and wider impact

The creative and cultural sector employs more than 30,000 people in over 7,500 companies in Essex.


Prior to the pandemic, Essex had the third largest creative sector in the UK, with the arts and cultural sector worth an estimated total of £2.6 billion.

Research by the GLA found that in the UK, for all creative industries, the estimated total supply chain spend is £127bn. For example, the National Theatre in London is serviced by over 200 individual businesses across the country.\*\*

### Essex County Council Arts and Cultural Fund

In 2021 ECC committed to supporting the Arts, cultural and Creative sectors with an investment of  $\pm 1.5$ m over 5 years.

This funding will enable ECC to provide an annual Arts and Cultural Fund to which artists, cultural organisations and creative practitioners can apply.

It has also provided funding for additional resource and for the Essex Film Office to be set up.

2022 Arts and Cultural Fund

**202** applications received

Nearly **25%** of applications received all, or part of the funding they requested

Grants were made for a cross section of projects covering a **range of creative and cultural disciplines** 

The smallest award was £2,500 and the largest £25,000

Enabling projects and artists to deliver work across the whole of the county, but particularly in areas identified as **priority areas for levelling up.**

What the fund *will* support:




### Geographical reach -ECC funding of The Arts and Culture 2022/3

# The value of Arts and Culture:

### The Explore Essex Art Commission

Enabling young people to express their thoughts and concerns about climate change through art.



"Quite a few children that normally don't get involved got really stuck in. one child in particular who struggles to engage and doesn't speak much in class was coming up with loads of ideas."

"Year 3's are really struggling as its a big transition from learning through play as you do in 1st 2 years. By Year 3, a certain independence and focus is expected. Due to Covid, they are way behind and needing a lot of pastoral support which isn't available due to time constraints in class, so learners are falling behind and getting upset. Teachers are drowning as there's no time to step away from the Curriculum and so many children just aren't bouncing back."

"Many people speak about the power of Music for those living with a diagnosis of dementia. They talk about awakenings and immediate retrieval of short-term memory and all of that is true. However very little consideration has been given for individuals living in the early stage of dementia and those diagnosed at working age. When working with this group there is so much more to consider. Intervention and interactions must be delivered, like all interactions, in a way that is inclusive, supportive, understanding, gentle and kind.....you brought each of these qualities in abundance."

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## Essex Film Office

UK spend on film and high-end TV productions for the full year 2021 was £5.64 billion. This is the highest since records began, and £1.27 billion higher than the previous peak reported in 2019.

"The creative industries contribute £115.9b GVA to the UK economy, with well over £8bn of that attributed to businesses from the creative screen sub-sectors" UK Business Angels Association / Creative England

"Creative England is able to calculate the average amount production spends when filming on location. With a television production's estimated spend of £22,000 per day and a major feature film around £42,000, on everything from local caterers, security and taxi firms, to hotels, restaurants and coffee shops."
