	This decision would support the earlier ECC decision in March 2021 to agree to sign a Back to Back to Agreement with Hertfordshire County Council to discharge specific activities identified in a Housing Infrastructure Grant contract between Hertfordshire County Council and Homes England. One of those activities is to establish a Recovery and Recycling Strategy for S106 receipts in Harlow and Gilston Garden Town and the Memorandum of Understanding is the basis of the agreement of the Harlow and Gilston Garden Town partners on this matter.

The MOU itself is a non legally binding agreement between partners to manage a future Rolling Infrastructure Fund which will deliver additional transport and other infrastructure across the Harlow and Gilston Area. Specific infrastructure projects will be brought forward when future S106 funding is sufficient within the Rolling Infrastructure Fund to allow. At that point project specific consultation will take place on infrastructure design and objectives. At this stage the overall principle of delivering sustainable transport and other infrastructure is consistent with key local policy documents including the ECC Local Transport Plan, the Harlow Local Plan and the Harlow Transport Strategy. These have undergone extensive consultation at different times and with different groups.
