Current performance is 7.4% (July 2009) which was behind the July 2008 result of 5.3%, There are seasonal variations and we will expect to see higher results in August. The increases in 14-17 year olds in care has continued in 2009/10 with current performance at 518 compared to a target for the year of 408. As a result of our current performance the forecast for 2009/10 is red. This area was referred to Policy and Scrutiny Committee from the November 2008 Scorecards for 2008/09. This area is to be referred to Policy and Scrutiny Committee:	The Assessment and Child Protection Service are reviewing this indicator in respect of the number of adolescents coming into care and the number of adolescents (Section 20) returning home. This will help better understand the position with regards to 14-17 year olds in care. Since the Wandsworth judgement, there is a duty on the LA to view all vulnerable people age 16/17 who are placed in non LA accommodation as CLA. As a result there is a 'bulge' of adolescents in the care system and therefore this indicator may not improve in the short term.	Work has commenced to break this local indicator down into age groups and length of time in care rather than total number of 14-17 year olds in care. This will enable us to identify groupings of children in care and target resource or support appropriately.

There has been a further drop in 2009/10 with performance for July at 8.1% against a target of 6%. In July there was a spike due to 2 sibling groups ceasing to have a child protection plan, which had lasted more than 2 years. As a result of current performance the forecast for 2009/10 is currently red. This area was referred to Policy and Scrutiny Committee from the November 2008 Scorecards for 2008/09. This area is to be referred to Policy and Scrutiny Committee: This is a re-referral. The 2008/09 target was missed and there is a red forecast assessment for 2009/10.	It was expected at the start of 2009/10 that this indicator would decline before it could improve due to a thorough audit of child protection cases. Forecast predications based on trends to date show the 2009/10 outturn will be close to the 2008/9 outturn, at 7%. The service is provided with lists of children with a child protection plan between 11 and 13 months in duration, and 18 month plus. These lists are used to schedule reviews of these cases and seek alternative arrangements for these children, where appropriate, therefore, in most cases, being removed from CPP before reaching 2 years duration. There are currently 22 children with a CPP for more than 2 years, if these children cease to have this plan during this year, they will fall into this measure.	

Note: In addition, provisional results suggest that other educational targets will not be met for 2009/10 (relating to the 2008/09 academic year). The data is currently provisional (as identified on the LAA and Corporate Plan Scorecards) and final results are expected to be available in early 2010.
