**Early Years and Childcare Funding Panel Recommendations**

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### 1. Purpose of report

1.1. For the Chief Officer for Education and Lifelong Learning, Early Years and Childcare to consider the applications which have been recommended by the Early Years and Childcare Funding Panel.

#### 2. Recommendations

2.1. For the Chief Officer for Education and Lifelong Learning, Early Years and Childcare to approve and sign off the recommendations made by the Early Years and Childcare Funding Panel.

#### 3. Background and proposal

- 3.1. The Early Years and Childcare Funding Panel (the Panel) meets monthly and is chaired by Councillor Tony Ball, Deputy Cabinet Member for Education and Lifelong Learning.
- 3.2. The Panel considers applications made to Essex County Council (ECC) by early years and childcare providers for revenue funding which support high quality provision, inclusion of children with special and additional needs.
- 3.3. Terms of Reference, details of funding available and application processes are available as background papers, as detailed in section 10.1
- 3.4 The Panel have considered and recommended those applications made to the Panel for approval by the Chief Officer for Education and Lifelong Learning, Early Years and Childcare.

#### 4. Policy context and Outcomes Framework

#### These proposal support our planned activities to

- Deliver school readiness intervention projects in county hotpots linked to district GLD outcomes and working with the broad definition of disadvantage.
- Ensure all early years & childcare provision and schools in every community are judged good or outstanding by Ofsted
- 4.1. Under Section 6 of the *Childcare Act 2006*, ECC must ensure that there is sufficient childcare within the local area. Section 6 of the Act defines 'sufficient childcare' as sufficient to meet the requirements of parents in the area who require childcare in order to enable them to take up, or remain in, work or undertake education or training which could reasonably be expected to assist them to obtain work.
- 4.2. Section 7 of the Childcare Act sets out a duty to secure free early years provision for preschool children. Currently every child aged three or four is entitled to 15 hours per week free early years provision for 38 weeks of the year.
- 4.3. The Free Early Education Entitlement for 2 year olds (FEE2) currently entitles the 40% most disadvantaged 2 year olds to 15 hours per week of free nursery education.
