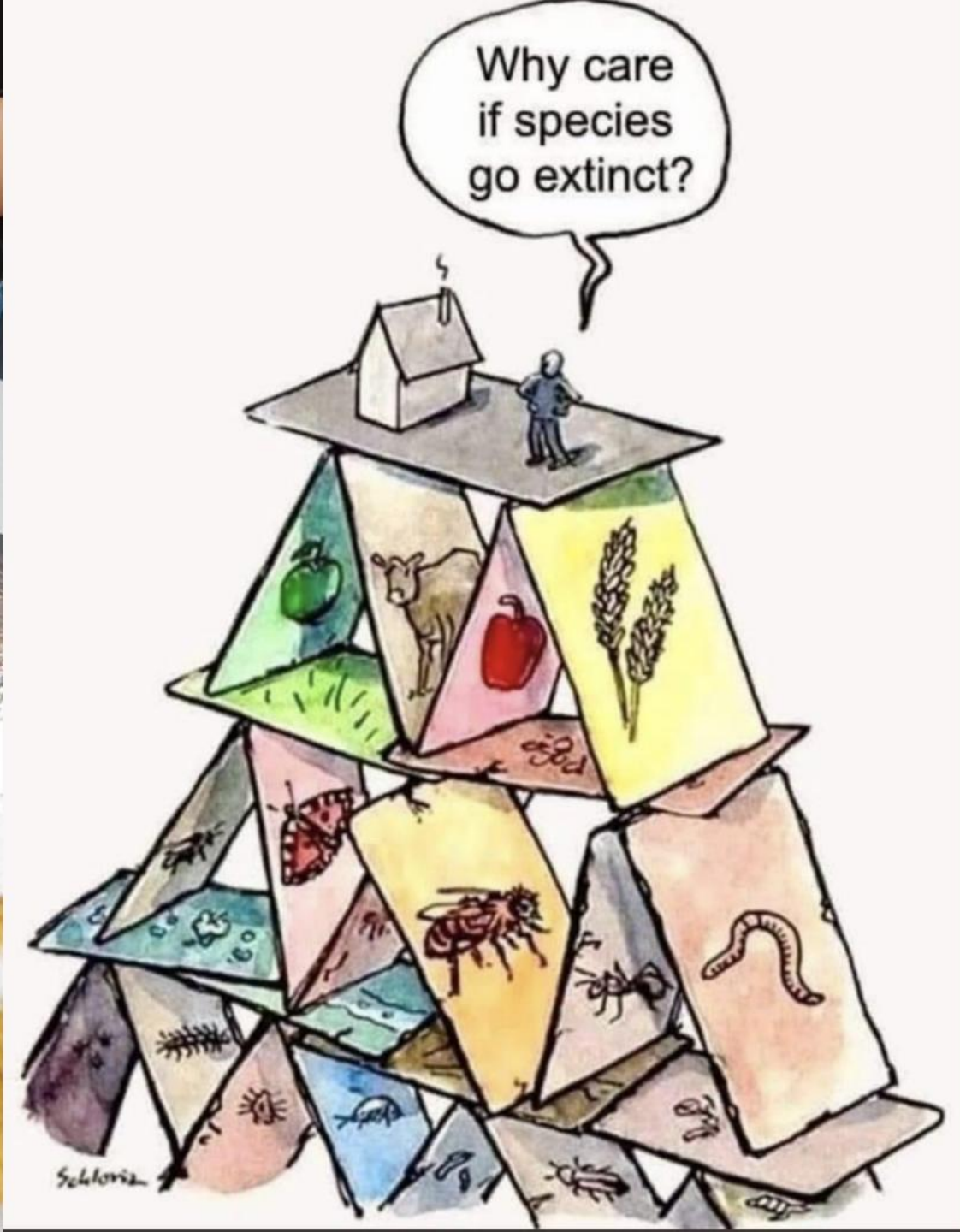
It consists of 4 weeks of

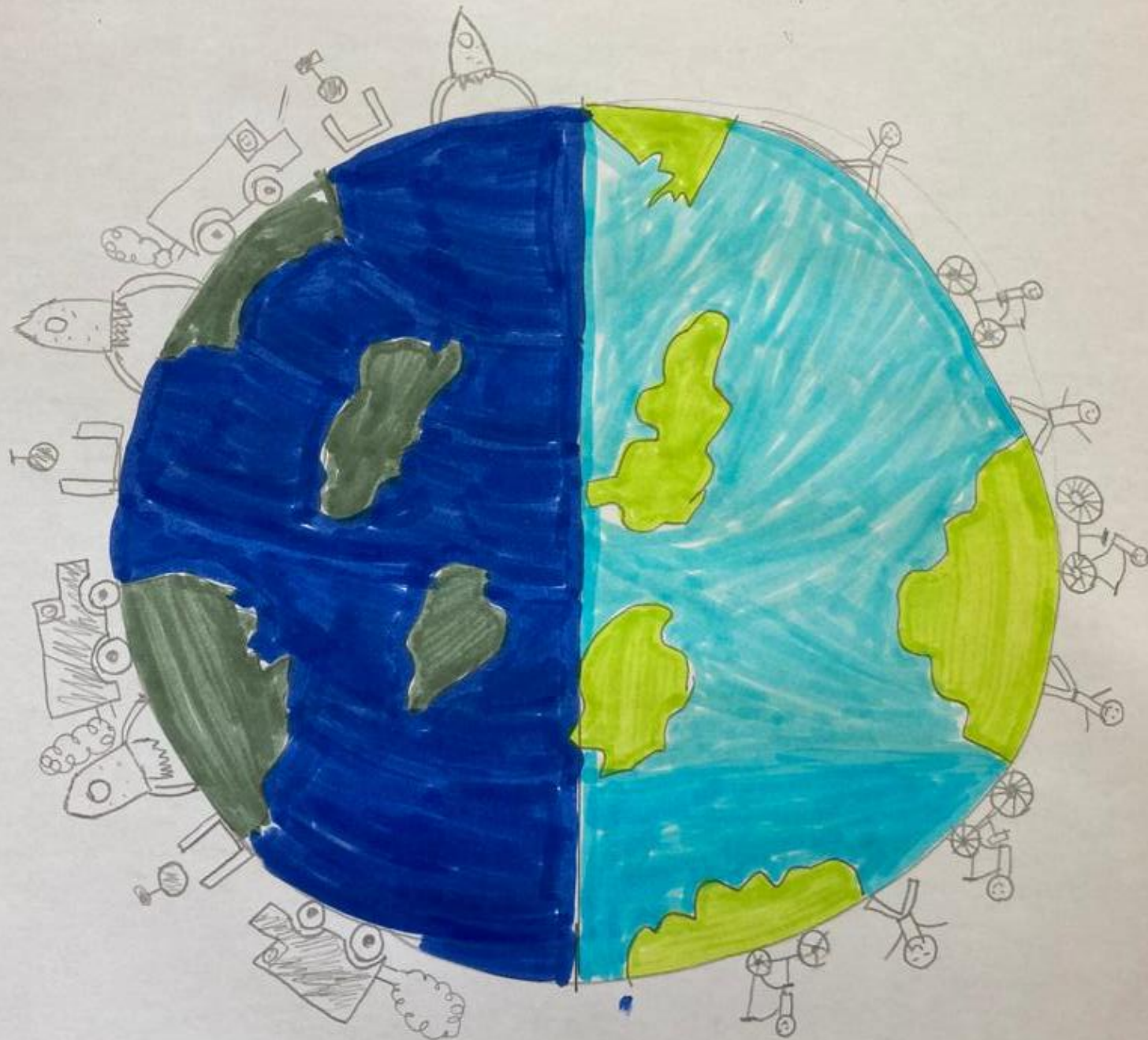
