No resources are withdrawn by what is proposed, and the potential impact upon the local community is that more parents/ carers will be able to send their children to a preferred local school.

A consultation has been carried out (March/ April 2021), to test the community's reaction to what is proposed. There were 133 positive responses. Some concerns were also raised, the principle ones being that the Academy was too small to take additional pupils and had too few staff to teach them. Both issues are mitigated within what is planned, as the expansion will be delivered through the provision of extra accommodation and additional teaching staff will be employed to ensure that the Academy has staff numbers that are appropriate to its new size. Having considered these concerns, the Ormiston Academies Trust has signalled its contentment to proceed with the proposal on the terms that were presented to the local community, and will seek the permission of the Regional Schools Commissioner to expand in size using ECC funding.

As public buildings, schools are required to provide full accessibility in order to obtain Building Control sign-off. Essex County Council produces a set of employer's requirements which add further interpretation to ensure this is achieved from the early stages of design. Prior to planning permission application Building Control approval is sought to offer earlier compliance confirmation. Any works to expand the building will be fully compliant with the legislation. This builds in a future-proofing dimension to our buildings, ensuring they are accessible for disabled users.
