




The Opportunity for Essex


The size of the prize for a green economy is potentially huge – but can only be captured if we act now and act differently

The transition to a green economy will need skilled workers to deliver it. By 2030, Essex alone is projected to need **18,000 green jobs**, including:
















Retrofitting the County's housing stock, the ECC estate, and our Anchors will also play a role in the future of our economy, with an opportunity worth:
