Rescues or persons from water/mud


ECFRS has attended 114 incident where persons required rescuing from water or mud

63% of the rescues were persons in water or at immediate risk of entering the water and 18% were release of persons from mud.

To date, 2019 was seen to have the highest number of rescues over previous years, by the end of 2020, its highly likely that ECFRS will have attended more rescues that 2019.

2020 has seen an increase in the number of incidents where persons have required rescuing from mud.


Rescue of persons from water or mud

More incidents involve males than females


All fatalities were males

The Strood





Blue Light Response

The Strood on to Mersea Island.

- Incidents at the Strood are all related to the spring tides and traffic trying to across whilst the roadway is covered in water.
- Last eighteen months 16 calls to persons trapped in their vehicle due to flood water, all requiring a multi-agency blue light response, Fire, Police, Ambulance and Coastguard.
- 10 people rescued.



Buttsbury Ford








Blue Light Response

Buttsbury Ford.

- Incidents at Buttsbury are all related to periods of heavy rain, the river level increasing and level at the ford becoming excessive for vehicles to pass.
- Last eighteen months; 16 calls to persons trapped, all requiring a multi-agency blue light response, Fire, Police, Ambulance.
- 15 people rescued.
