Essex Music Service Officers will then set clear priorities for the investment of the monies raised, ensuring that it reaches vulnerable and disadvantaged young people and does not replicate the funding and investment made through the Arts Council England funding received.

Music Service officers will then receive reports from Essex Community Foundation of the impact of the funding along with evaluation reports which will then inform the future investments of funding from Essex Community Foundation.

This approach will support the sustained provision of music activity across leveling up communities in Essex.
