<p>Traffic Management Act 2004: network management in response to COVID-19 Saffron Walden Town Centre</p> <p>Following the Public Notice issued 15th June 2020 under Section 14(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (appendix A) approval is hereby given for an additional notice to be issued to continue the traffic management measures in force for an additional 21days.</p> <p>The second notice to be issued on 6th July 2020 identifies the addition of a 20 mph speed limit on the following lengths of road:-</p> <p>B184 High Street From its junction with Gold Street northwards to a point approximately 5 metres south of its junction with Castle Street</p> <p>B184 East Street From its junction with Hill Street eastwards for 25 metres</p> <p>Fairycroft Road From its junction with East Street southwards for 7 metres</p> <p>Cross street From its junction with the B184 high Street to its junction with Market Row</p> <p>And the entire length of the following roads Butcher Row, Church Street, Common Hill, Emson Close, George Street, Hill Street, Market Hill, Market Place, Market Row Market Street</p> <p>The lower speed limit is to facilitate safe social distancing as a response to the Covid-19 measures required by central government.</p> <p>Before the end of the second 21day notice period a Chief Officer Action Form will be prepared detailing all comments made in relation to the traffic management installed as the immediate response to the Covid-19 pandemic, and will seek confirmation to move to publishing a Temporary Traffic Regulation Order under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act that may remain in force for up to 18 months.</p> <p>Essex County Council and Saffron Walden Town Council with Uttlesford District Council have been working together and will monitor the scheme and its impact on traffic flows in the town liaising closely with local businesses and residents.</p>
