- Members were keen to retain the telephone booking system and promote the scheme and options for non-internet users.
- Members were keen for officers to look at income-generating opportunities including commercial waste and re-use shops.
- Further information on the consultation responses (numbers not just percentages, any information on queues around bank holidays, etc) would be supplied to the Committee.



Consultation completed with 4545 responses


Good representation from across the county. Slight over representation from Basildon, Chelmsford, Colchester and Tendring. Under representation from Harlow and Epping Forest



Key principles


These slides show quantitative data only, further insight will be drawn from qualitative outputs.

Targets & Ambitions

Around half of respondents felt that the targets and ambitions are about right. A further 28% of respondents would prefer more ambitious targets and ambitions.

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Net zero greenhouse gas emissions



We will contribute to reducing the county's greenhouse gas emissions to net zero by 2050.

Waste reduction



We will halve the amount of residual waste produced per person by 2042.



We aim to reduce waste by 10% by 2030.



We aspire that Essex will be a zero waste county by 2055.

Recycling



We will reuse, recycle, or compost 65% of waste by 2035.



We aim to reuse, recycle or compost at least 70% of waste by 2030.

Waste disposal



We will send no more than 10% of waste to landfill by 2035.



We aim to send zero waste to landfill by 2030.

Collection Services



We will ensure that all Essex residents have access to separate food waste collections by 2026.




We will ensure that all Essex residents have access to comprehensive recycling services for plastic, paper and card, metal, glass, food and garden waste, by 2026.

The EWP will create plans, publish our progress and regularly review this strategy to ensure it is fit for purpose. The EWP will seek further involvement from residents throughout the life of this strategy.

Strategic Environmental Assessment

- 275 responses on the Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) report
- A significant number of responses received from Basildon (70 responses), Braintree (32 responses) and Tendring (41).
- Statutory respondents indicate that the draft SEA is broadly acceptable
- Respondents are divided on whether the SEA is correctly identifying the likely significant effects of the draft strategy (Yes 54% / No 46%).
- Further exploration is needed on these results and the related comments from respondents





Emerging Insights

- Good level of agreement observed from all localities on key proposals.
- Agreement with the proposal to use Energy from Waste is high, but siting and environmental impact are areas of concern
- Reducing the use of landfill had high support
- Affordability of the strategy and the impact on council tax remain important to respondents
- The vision of a zero-waste county was misunderstood by many respondents
- A significant minority of respondents were unsure about Anaerobic Digestion
- Respondents want manufactures and retailers to take greater responsibility, and easy to use recycling services
 - There was strong agreement to the principle of councils working in collaboration


