

Briefing Paper for Essex and Southend Overview & Scrutiny Committees Proposed Service Redesign of Contraceptive and Sexual Health Service in South East Essex

Background

NHS South East Essex Community Healthcare currently provides contraceptive services for South East Essex. The GP registered population of Castle Point, Rochford and Southend is approx. 360,000. It is served by a main Contraceptive and Sexual Health service provided from Kingsley-Ward Centre (open six days per week) and seven satellite clinics held in community clinics (see appendix 1 for clinic lists and opening times).

The service has seen a continuous rise in client contacts over the past five years. In the year 2008/2009 36,000 episodes of care were given. Many of the clients who attend clinic arrive with multiple complex problems, which require skilled knowledgeable staff to deal with them. The service runs an open door policy in an attempt to improve access to the young and vulnerable clients, whose lives are often chaotic and who traditionally do not keep appointments.

However there are anomalies within the service and these are demonstrated in the four satellite clinics held at Benfleet, Hadleigh, Thundersley and Kent Elms (see appendix 2) which are held on either a monthly basis or twice a month. In these 4 clinics attendances have been declining (ie dropped 21% in 2 years) and attendance in the under 25 year old age group is low when compared with other clinics. In the year 2008/2009 these four clinics provided only 0.4% of the total episodes of care across South East Essex. The number on the active case load at Benfleet Clinic is 17 clients, at Hadleigh 11, at Kent Elms 18 and at Thundersley it is 23.

The new challenges faced now centre on engaging with traditionally hard to reach groups by working with local partners (e.g. Youth Service, Looked-after Children's Nurse etc). The aim of this work will be to reduce teenage conceptions across South East Essex, increase access to sexually transmitted infection screening and increase Chlamydia screening in the under 25 year old age group to meet national targets.

Having analysed the workload and efficiencies of the service as part of a service review, it has become clear that these four satellite clinics do not meet client needs as well as having very low case loads. It is proposed that these clinics are re-provided in the other Contraception and Sexual Health Care Service clinics. The savings achieved will be re-directed into outreach work which will target vulnerable groups and enhance services at other satellite

services, including access to screening for HIV, Syphilis, Gonorrohoea and Chlamydia. This means the population of South East Essex will not have to travel further than 5 miles to access Contraception and Sexual Health Services.

We plan to advise and engage with the community as well as with clients by using the following routes.

- 1. Writing to them on an individual basis (where we have had prior permission to correspond with them at home) this will be possible in approximately 75% of the case load.
- 2. Communicating clinic changes by use of local media, targeting appropriate publications for different age ranges.
- 3. Producing flyers to be distributed to all local partners e.g GPs, health visitors, midwives, school nurses, youth services, youth councils and voluntary sector organisations.

Any concerns will be addressed on an individual basis, making individual plans of care where required. An example of this would be for clients who have an underlying health issue such as a long term condition – we might be able to deliver their sexual health care in their own home.

This engagement process will be carried out over a period of two months to allow adequate time for clients/staff to respond and for individual care plans to be agreed.

SERVICES OFFERED

- Confidential consultations with expert advice for males and females
- Free Birth Control supplies
- Free Emergency contraception
- Free Pregnancy tests
- Help and advice on unplanned pregnancy, which could include termination referral or advice on continuing with the pregnancy.
- Pre-conception help and advice
- Sexual health advice including chlamydia screening and self testing
- Support for those with disabilities and those in need of social /emotional support
- Coil fitting (intra-uterine devices/systemsassessment and screening is required 2 weeks before the fitting appointment)
- Cervical screening (available to women who have received a letter requesting them to attend for screening). A Drop-In service for cervical screening is available on Saturdays from 9.00am 11.00am or alternatively an appointment can be made to attend at other times during the week.

WILL I HAVE TO SEE A DOCTOR?

Not always, unless you prefer to, or the Nurse feels it is important for you to do so. It may be possible for some of the Nurses to prescribe certain oral contraception without being first seen by the Doctor. These Nurses have undergone specific additional training and are described as Independent / Supplementary Nurse Prescribers, it will be up to these Nurses whether this is possible depending on your medical history.

Here at the Kingsley Ward Centre, everyone attending, (including under 16 years old), will be treated with respect and will be seen in privacy.


The Fraser Guidelines will apply to any clients under 16 years of age:- and the nurse will ensure that:-

- The young person will understand the professional's advice;
- The young person cannot be persuaded to inform their parents;
- The young person is likely to begin, or to continue having, sexual intercourse with or without contraceptive treatment;
- Unless the young person receives contraceptive treatment, their physical or mental health, or both, are likely to suffer;
- The young person's best interests require them to receive contraceptive advice or treatment with or without parental consent.




Total Number of Male & Female Contacts 2008-09
