Project Background

In July 2021 the Essex Climate Action Commission (ECAC) reiterated the risks to our county of increasing extreme weather, rising sea levels, food shortages, and **water scarcity**.

The Emerging Water Resources Regional Plan for Eastern England (January 2022) highlights how agriculture, growth, energy, food, and water supplies in this region will be affected by water insecurity.

The consequences of having too little water and of uncertainty of supply can have devastating effects on wellbeing, planning for economic growth and on the environment.

The Essex Water Strategy which will address the **gap in sub-regional holistic understanding and options** to deal with our water resources problem.



Problem Statement

An accessible place-based strategy which explains the issue of in-year variability of water and water quality at a county and district scale is not currently available.


Neither is there an integrated multi-sector strategy which considers the challenges or identifies the actions which must be taken (by when and by whom) to tackle the problem at this scale.






- Extensive stakeholder engagement.
