1. Chief Constable's Report

As the Council will be aware, in his quarterly report to the Police Authority, the Chief Constable reviews the Force's performance against the Essex Policing Plan and includes other items of interest. The primary objectives for Essex Police being:

- Improve public confidence in policing;
- Deliver our Policing Pledge to the public;
- Reduce recorded crime focusing on a number of specific crime types, anti-social behaviour and repeat incidents of domestic violence;
- Increase the detection rates for key serious crime types and dismantle organised crime groups;
- Reduce the risk of harm to our communities by tackling the supply and misuse of illicit drugs;
- Reduce the risk of harm to our communities by addressing specific areas of our protective services capability;
- Have an effective and representative workforce;
- Deliver even better value for money.

The Chief Constable informed us:

- That crime in Essex continues to fall. For the first three months of 2010/11, Essex Police recorded 472 fewer crimes compared to the first three months of 2009/10. This represents a 1.7% reduction in total crime. Furthermore, there were fewer dwelling burglary offences, serious violent crime offences, assault with less serious injury offences and racially-aggravated crime offences.
- There have also been 2,707 fewer incidents of anti-social behaviour recorded in the first three months of 2010/11 compared to the same period in 2009/10.
- That the Force have extended its range of methods for dealing with offenders to allow greater discretion for officers to deal with crimes at an appropriate level. Neighbourhood Resolutions have been introduced for low-level offences and anti-social behaviour. They are generally used when the person is a first-time offender and it is seen as appropriate, by police and by the victim, for the offender to resolve to the satisfaction of the victim through an apology, financial recompense, or similar.



- That Essex Police took part in the national ACPO Summer Drink Drive Campaign, designed to highlight the dangers of drinking and driving. During the period 2,556 roadside tests were conducted with a failure rate of 6.65% (170 fail / refuse).
- That as part of the Bikesafe initiative, Essex Police have been working with Essex County Council to run 'PIT STOP' events. These take place on priority motorcycle KSI routes where communities have expressed a feeling of vulnerability at weekends from increased motorcycle traffic. All motorcycles are stopped and invited onto an off-road site where they are offered complimentary refreshments, provided by Essex County Council, and the chance to receive an observed ride out by a police motorcycle rider. Individuals are also encouraged to commit to the national Bikesafe training courses. Each event attracts between 200 400 riders.
- That Essex Police's continuing success in reducing crime shows the Force ranked second in our Most Similar Forces (MSF) group¹ for crimes per head of population (i.e. the second lowest crime rate).
- That gun crime is showing a continuing downward trend during this period with a 20% decrease on the same period last year, with 32 offences reported during the period. Knife crime has also shown a reduction of 15% on the same period last year, with 134 offences recorded compared with 157 in 2009/10.
