Report of the annual meeting held on 7 June 2010 (For information)

1. Chairman and Vice-Chairman

I was re-appointed as Chairman and we re-appointed Mr Neil Macdonald, an Independent Member, as our Vice-Chairman, for the ensuing year.

2. Chief Constable's Report

A full copy of the Chief Constable's Quarterly Report for the period 1 January to 31 March 2010 is contained in our meeting's agenda and further copies are available on request.

As the Council will be aware, in his quarterly report to the Police Authority, the Chief Constable reviews the Force's performance against the Essex Policing Plan and includes other items of interest. The primary objectives for Essex Police being:

- Improve public confidence in policing;
- Deliver our Policing Pledge to the public;
- Reduce recorded crime, anti-social behaviour and repeat incidents of domestic abuse by at least 5 percent;
- Increase the recorded crime sanction detection rate to 42 percent;
- Increase the number of drug offenders brought to justice by 10 percent;
- Reduce serious road traffic casualties by 5 percent;
- Reduce the risk of harm to the public by enhancing our capability to deliver Protective Services in line with the national standards;
- Ensure our communities remain safe by promoting and developing the UK counter-terrorism strategy;
- Have an effective and representative workforce;
- Maximise Force efficiency and productivity to enhance the frontline.

The Chief Constable informed us:

- That the performance of Essex Police has continued to improve with levels of reported crime continuing to fall during the quarter. It was reported that Essex Police had recorded 8,046 fewer crimes in 2009/10 when compared to the same period the previous year. We heard that crime was down by 7.1% in total and that continuing success in reducing crime shows the Force ranked second in our Most Similar Forces (MSF) Group.
- That the number of people killed and seriously injured (KSI) on Essex roads continues to fall. The Chief Constable informed us that a DVD entitled Driving with Grace had been launched by the friends of Eleanor Grace McGrath who was tragically killed in a road traffic collision. The

DVD has been distributed to all schools in the UK, Road Safety Officers and Police Forces to promote road safety amongst young drivers.

- That Operation Petrel was launched on 1st March which aimed to increase public confidence by concentrating upon enforcement and the education of motorcycle riders on 15 motorcycle KSI routes within the Force area.
- That during the quarter, the total KSIs recorded were 156, which represent a 9% reduction on the 171 recorded during the same period last year.
- That motorcycle casualties have also reduced by 12 KSI casualties compared with the same quarter last year.
- That gun and knife crime had shown a continued downward trend during this period. Gun crime had shown a continued downward trend during the period with a 33.3% decrease when compared to the same period last year. Knife crime had also shown a reduction of 4.6% on the same period last year.
- That a Special Constabulary weekend had taken place on 5th and 7th February 2010, called Operation Keel, which focused on local priorities, for example, speeding, traffic offences and inconsiderate parking. 320 motorists were spoken to during the operation, 51 fixed penalty notices given, 13 reports for process and 4 arrests were made. This operation was well received by the local people.
- That Family Intervention projects were taking place throughout the County, which bring together key agencies to deal with issues associated with troublesome families.
- That performance has improved against all the Communications Division targets. End of year performance results exceed the targets set out in all areas and show improvement against last year.

⁴ Definition – Domestic violence (abuse) is defined by ACPO as 'any incidence of threatening behaviour, violence or abuse (psychological, physical, sexual, financial or emotional) between adults (aged 18 or over), who are or have been intimate partners or family members, regardless of gender or sexuality.

⁵ MARAC – those victims (cases) of domestic violence referred to a MARAC will be those who have been identified as high or very high risk (i.e. of serious injury or of being killed). For the purposes of this indicator, a case should be defined as a combination of a victim and a perpetrator (or groups of perpetrators) being reviewed at the same MARAC. The MARAC target shown is the national repeat level.
