Executive summary

Title of policy or decision: Implementation of the Essex County Council Contact Tracing Service

Describe the main aims, objectives and purpose of the policy (or decision): To seek agreement to make the necessary arrangements to have a contact tracing service in place in Essex and Southend on Sea by 29 June 2020. This follows the announcement of the Department of Health and Social Care (DoHSC) on 27 May 2020 regarding its plan to launch the national 'NHS Test and Trace' service.

As part of the DoHSC plans, it was confirmed that although the central service will be run by Public Health England, local authorities would be asked to support, and set up contact tracing services within their respective local areas, and as part of this would need to develop their own outbreak control plans, working in partnership with their regional Public Health England (PHE) colleagues, local NHS and other stakeholders. Local authorities are to be responsible for identifying and containing potential outbreaks in high risk settings such as schools, care homes and workplaces.

The Council proposes to deliver the service by commissioning an external provider to deliver the contact tracing service (the "Service") on behalf of Essex and Southend-on-Sea Borough Council. This will be delivered through a dedicated call handling service with the provision of specialist staff with skills in contact tracing investigations.

Officers have developed a local outbreak control plan for Essex and Southend-on-Sea which provides the governance for the contact tracing service, and includes specific outbreak control plans for particular settings such as schools, care homes, workplaces, vulnerable groups and high-risk settings or communities.

As outlined above as part of DoHSC plans, the Council will be working with other District, Borough and City Councils in relation to outbreaks who will provide the support of Environmental Health Officer support for outbreaks in particular settings, such as prisons, workplaces, care homes etc.
