The consultation period ran from 10th October 2019 - 7th November 2019. Thirty one (31) responses were received, with 27 in favour and 4 against. Those who responded against the expansion proposal, raised issues that fell into two areas:

- a) Making the school bigger, ruins the small feel of the school
- b) Wanted a sixth form included in the expansion

The first issue will be addressed by the school in ensuring the school maintains its sense of character. The second issue of including a Sixth Form sits outside the Local Authority's power, as Post-16 education is the responsibility of the Education Skills & Funding Agency.
