#### **Executive summary**

Title of policy / decision: Procurement of Individual Packages of Education Support

**Overview of policy / decision:** The Provision of Individual Packages of Educational Support Framework was established in April 2019 to meet the LA's statutory responsibilities under section 19 of the Education Act 1996. This framework facilitates the purchase of individually tailored packages of Education support for young people of statutory school age in Key Stages 1-4.

These students will have a range of backgrounds that could include (but is not limited to) being excluded, being in public care and have had disrupted care placements, young offenders.

The key area of Family includes a commitment to improve the Outcomes for the most vulnerable and disadvantaged groups including Children in Care, Care Leavers, Children with SEND and children from BAME communities, by working with children, young people and partners across the system.

What actions have already been taken to mitigate any negative impacts: Consistent with achieving these commitments the paper sets out a proposal for the re- procurement of a range of Alternative Education Provision (AP) Services that support children and young people, with and without Education, Health and Care Plans (EHCPs) who by reason of illness, exclusion from school or otherwise, may not for any period receive suitable education. The current framework contract expires on 31st March 2023.
