This will also strengthen its relationship with service users and other agencies involved with CAMHS. There are approximately 253,000 children over the age of five years old in Essex. At least 10% of these have a diagnosable mental health disorder. It is essential; therefore, that the service is reviewed to ensure it provides an adequate service for these young people. Members will be seen to have examined the adequacy of the Council's ability to assist young people with mental health disorders. There will either be recognition that service delivery is acceptable or gaps identified and recommendations developed to improve services.
