Executive summary

Title of policy or decision: The Essex Community Wellbeing Service - NHS Health Checks

Describe the main aims, objectives and purpose of the policy (or decision): To procure a single, integrated, countywide Essex Community Wellbeing Service, and which will be delivered by a single lead provider. This new Service will include the NHS Health Checks programme.

In April 2013, the NHS Health Check became a statutory public health service in England. Local authorities are responsible for making provision to offer an NHS Health Check to eligible individuals aged 40-74 years once every five years.

The NHS Health Check programme aims to help prevent heart disease, stroke, type 2 diabetes, kidney disease and certain types of dementia. During the risk assessment standardised tests are used to measure key risk factors and establish the person's risk of developing cardiovascular disease (CVD). The outcome of the assessment is then used to raise awareness of and identify CVD risk factors, with advice and support being given to help reduce or manage risk.

Senior Health Checks:

Whilst the NHS Health Checks Programme systematically screens people aged 40 - 74 years there is no national service for older people who are at an increased risk of disease.

As part of the new Community Wellbeing Service, the provider will be required to focus on identifying older adults aged 75-84 with previously undiagnosed disease, including management of risk factors, and in turn reduce the risk of cardiovascular disease.

However, there remain marked variations across areas of Essex in terms of prevalence of related conditions including diabetes, hypertension, and coronary heart disease (CHD). These tend to be most prevalent in more deprived areas, for Tendring and Maldon, which have consistently high prevalence compared to other areas.

It is anticipated that COVID-19 may further impact, ie those with underlying health conditions may be at higher risk of mortality and higher risk of developing conditions. This may also be further exacerbated by people delaying or not seeking care during the pandemic.

Senior Health Checks will focus on identifying older adults aged 75-84 with previously undiagnosed disease, including management of risk factors. This will reduce the risk of the ageing population developing CVD, as well as other long term health conditions.
