However, should ECC not amalgamate the schools, the infant school would be required to find a headteacher to replace the interim arrangements, which will cease in December 2020. A key driver for the amalgamation is to secure improved outcomes at the infant school, ensuring pupils who attend the school have fair access to high quality education.

The percentage of pupils at the schools in January 2020 who were identified as White British was 69.6% in the infant school and 74.3% in the junior school, compared with a figure of 76.3% across the Colchester District as a whole in the same age range. The creation of the primary school will not change the arrangements for admission to Reception year, meaning that the same number of children within the local community will have the opportunity to access education at the new primary. There is no reason to suggest that any element of the proposal will affect these percentages directly.
